

Community Engagement

The purpose of Pickens Arts and Cultural Alliance since 2007 has been to support and aid in the growth and education of art within the community. Throughout 2024, we have been in support of many local arts programs that include assistance in art classes, grant funding, and donations. These local programs vary to include the local Tater Patch Players, community home school theatre programs, HH Academy Programs, Sassafras Literary Exchange writing programs, arts programs in the local school systems, Bent Tree musical groups, and Casual Classics and many more.

In addition to our arts development purpose, PACA also works to ensure our rich history and cultural roots are preserved and supported. Pickens has provided grant funding for the historical preservation of The Old Jail House, The Old Tate Gym, and assisted with lighting and preservation for community murials.

We have made ground breaking changes in our operations, and we are excited to list out what we are doing to improve our operations:


- Hiring Executive Coordinator Mindy Marshall
